

A Special Meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Dallas Township was held on Tuesday, August 10, 2021 at 5:30pm in the Municipal Building located at 105 Lieutenant Michael Cleary Drive, Dallas, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania for the purpose of a public hearing on corrections to the Dallas Township Zoning Map.

Those in attendance included: Supervisor Chairman William J. Grant, Supervisor Vice Chairman Elizabeth A. Martin, Supervisor Robert J. Wagner, Attorney Thomas J. Mosca, Township Manager Martin K. Barry, Township Engineer Thomas J. Doughton, Zoning/Code Enforcement Officer Carl M. Alber and Secretary/Treasurer K. Gary Kirk. Also in attendance were stenographer Rane Casier and 3 other individuals. Amy Thomas participated through GoTo Meeting. Marketing Consultant Amanda Faneck was at the Administration Building and set up Facebook Live to allow additional residents to participate in the meeting.

The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Supervisor Grant stated that this was a hearing on corrections to be made to the Dallas Township Zoning Map and that it was a continuation of the hearing from June 29, 2021 since there were technical issues with GoTo Meeting which resulted in some individuals missing the first 20 minutes of that hearing. He then turned the meeting over to Attorney Mosca.

Attorney Mosca had Township Engineer T. Doughton, Zoning/Code Enforcement Officer Alber and Township Manager Barry sworn in by the stenographer.

Attorney Mosca asked Township Engineer T. Doughton questions concerning the Zoning Map corrections. He discussed that the corrections to the map were for lines that were shown incorrectly and for a property that was not marked correctly by the person who did the map. He verified that the map being shown was the amended map.


Attorney Mosca asked Zoning/Code Enforcement Officer Alber questions concerning notices that he posted and mailed. He stated that he provided notices to all property owners who will have changes, posted a notice at those properties and mailed notices to anyone within 200 feet of the properties being changed.

Attorney Mosca asked Township Manager Barry questions concerning the posting of the meeting and informing the Dallas Township Planning Commission and Luzerne County Planning Commission. He stated that he provided them with the proposed corrections and that he received back from the Dallas Township Planning Commission that they were in agreement with the corrections and the Luzerne County Planning Commission responded that they had no comments on the changes. He also stated that the hearing was posted in the newspaper and on the Dallas Township website.

There were not any questions or comments from those in attendance or participating through GoTo Meeting or Facebook Live.

Supervisor Wagner made a **Motion to adjourn**, seconded by Supervisor Martin and carried. The Meeting adjourned at 5:42pm.
